- EPA expertise in assessing chemical safety
- More than 15 years experience reviewing products
- Voluntary program

## Response to New Label



- Consumer Reports (May 2015):
  - Consumer Reports dedicated a full page to Safer Choice, explaining "why we like the label"
- Recent Partner Survey:
  - Majority of consumers surveyed feel the new label would be a compelling reason for them to try a product
- Retailer Response:
  - More than 2500 products qualify to use the label and are showing up on retailer store shelves everywhere

# What does the Safer Choice label mean?



- Provides trusted assurance from the U.S. EPA that products:
  - Contain safer ingredients meeting stringent health and environmental criteria
  - Are safer for families, pets, workers, communities, and the environment
  - Have been reviewed for performance



- An appealing label that consumers can trust
  - Facilitates rapid decision-making

### What's behind the label?



#### To use the label products must:

- Meet the <u>Safer Choice Standard</u>
  - Every chemical ingredient is <u>reviewed</u> for human health and environmental safety
  - Product level requirements include: performance, packaging, and ingredient disclosure
- Be covered under a Partnership Agreement between the manufacturer and EPA
  - Good for 3 years
- Undergo annual audits

- List of Safer Choice-labeled products
  - Updated every two weeks
  - More than 2,500 listed products
    - ~ 650 consumer/retail
    - Remaining are industrial & institutional
- Broad range of product categories. Most are laundry and cleaning products (e.g., detergents, all-purpose cleaners, degreasers)
- Potential for expansion to personal care products, adhesives, lubricants, and more


